Building or Library as the town may think proper

Art. 5th To see if the town will rescind any vote or votes passed at any previous meeting in reference to the bequest of the late John Goodnow, for a Library Building;

Art. 6th To see if the Town will grant or appropriate the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, or any other amount of money, to be added to the sum given to the town by the late John Goodnow, for the purpose of erecting a Library building in said town.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting an attested copy thereof at the Town House, at each of the public Meeting Houses and at some public place in the Village of Assabet in said town, two Sabbaths at least before the time of holding said meeting.

Whereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk, at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
