In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of

On Monday, the twenty-eighth day of July, next

the following articles, viz.

Art 1st To Choose a Moderator to preside in said Meeting:

Art 2^d To see if the town will pay a bounty to those persons who may have enlisted, or who shall enlist as volunteers into the service of the United States agreeable to General Order No. 26, to the number of fourteen, it being this town's proportion as set forth in said order; - to do or act in any way on the subject of said bounty and volunteers as the town shall think proper, and also borrow money to carry the same into effect.

Art 3 To see if the town will instruct the Selectmen to look after any sick or wounded volunteer who may have enlisted from said town into the service of the United States and furnish such assistance as may be necessary during such sickness: to do or act on said subject as the town may think best.

Art 4th To see if the town will designate some spot on which to erect a building for the Library bequeathed to the town by the late John Gordon of Boston: or to do or act in any way in reference to the location of said Library.
