At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury holden at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the 28th day of July A.D. 1862. the Articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows, viz:

Art 1st Chose Capt James Moore Moderator

Art 2^d Voted to pay a bounty of one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125.) to each volunteer who has enlisted or may enlist into the service of the United States in compliance with general Order No. 26 to the number of (14) fourteen. The above vote being counted, was declared to be as follows, One hundred and forty-five votes in the affirmative and one vote in the negative.

Voted also to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to pay the above bounty, or to give notes in behalf of the town, for the said amount, said notes bearing interest from the date of the holders of them being sworn into the service of the United States.

Voted also to instruct the Selectmen to use all proper means to encourage the enlistment of the above required number.

Art 3 Voted to instruct the Selectmen to look after and provide for any sick or wounded volunteer belonging to the Town of Sudbury, of ^{whom} which they shall have knowledge, in such way as they shall think proper, at the expense of the town

Voted to pass over the remaining articles in the above Warrant

Then voted to dissolve this meeting
