At a Legal Town Meeting holden at Snelbury on Thursday Sept 4th 1862. The Articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows, viz:

Art 1 Chose Capt James Moore, Moderator.

Art 2 Voted to pay the sum of one hundred dollars in addition the same sum voted at the town meeting held on the 19th day of August A.D. 1862, to each person who voluntarily enlists into the service of the United States for the term of nine months.

Art 3 Voted that the Selectmen be a committee to attend to the matter referred to in this article, and that the whole subject be left to said Selectmen, to take such action as shall seem to them to be for the interest of the town, but, that, in the opinion of the town, no proposals for settlement should be made.
Then Voted to dissolve this meeting.
