Goodnough and John R. Harriman, Constables of the Town of Sudbury, in said County
Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, qualified to vote in Town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said Sudbury, on Thursday, the 4th day of September, inst., at four o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following articles: viz.

Art 1 To Choose a Moderator to preside in said Meeting

Art 2 To see if the Town will take any farther measures to aid in procuring Volunteers for the nine months service, or take any action in reference to a delitional bounty to those who may have enlisted or may enlist into the service of the United States for said Term of nine months, and also to take any action relative to the families of said Volunteers as the town may think best, to do or act on the aforesaid subject as the town may think proper.

Art 3 To see if the Town will take any measures to settle a claim for damages, brought by Mr Ephraim Ray of Stow, against the Town, to do or act in any way on said subject as the Town shall judge best
