To Samuel A Jones, a Constable of the Town
of Sudbury, in said County. — Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts,
you are required to notify and warn the
inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, qualified
to vote in elections, to meet at the Town
Hall in said Sudbury, on Tuesday the fourth
day of November next, at ten o'clock in the
fore noon to bring in their votes to the Se-
lectmen for a Governor, Lieutenant Governor,
Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver General,
Auditor of Accounts and Attorney General,
for this Commonwealth, a Councillor for
District No. six, and a Senator for District
No. three, all on one ballot

Also, to bring in their Votes for a Sheriff,
three Commissioners of Insolvency, one County
Commissioner, two Special Commissioners
and a District Attorney for the County
of Middlesex, all on one ballot.

And to give in their ^{votes} for a Representative
in the Congress of the United States for
District No seven, and a Representative in
the next General Court of Massachusetts
for District No. sixteen upon separate
ballots. All the foregoing ballots to be de-
posited at one checking.

Polls to be opened at eleven o'clock
A.M. and may be closed at two o'clock
P.M.

And you are also required to notify and
warn the inhabitants of said Sudbury qual-
ified to vote in town affairs, to assemble
at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday
the fourth day of November next at one o'clock
