To Samuel A Jones, Constable of the Town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting;

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Friday the twelfth day of December, inst. at one o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following, articles viz;

- Art. 1st To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.
- Art. 2^d To see if the Town will take any further measures to procure volunteers for the nine months service, or take any action in reference to additional bounty for said nine months service, to do or act in any way on the foregoing subject as the town may think best, and also to borrow money to carry the same into effect.
- Art 3^d To see if the Town will authorize the Committee chosen to purchase books for the Goodnow Library, to use for said purpose any further sum of money, not exceeding two thousand dollars, in addition to the amount already voted by the town.
- Art 4th To see if the Town will choose a committee to draft rules and regulations for the management of the Goodnow Library, or take any action relative to the management of said Library that the town may think best; also to choose a Librarian.
