To Samuel A. Jones, Abram H. Good-nough and John R. Harriman, Constables of the Town of Sudbury in said County, Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said Sudbury, on

Wednesday, December the 17th inst. at one o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following articles, Viz:

- Art 1 To Choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.
- Art 2 To hear the report of the Committee, in reference to procuring men to fill the town's quota for the military service of the United States and act thereon in any way the town may think best.
- Art 3 To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen, to give the Executors of the will of the late John Goodnow, of Boston, a deed of a lot of ground in the new Cemetery for the purpose of building a Tomb thereon, to do or act as the town may think best.
- Art 4 To hear and act on reports.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by giving each legal voter, at least twelve hours notice of the time of meeting as aforesaid.

Whereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
