

Art 2^d Town Voted to instruct said committee, to procure the required number of men upon the terms proposed, or to make such arrangements with any other parties as may be more favorable to the town.

Art 3^d Voted to authorize the Selectmen to give a deed of a lot of Ground in the new Cemetery, to the Executors of the will of the late John Goodnow of Boston, for the purpose of building thereon, a tomb.

Art 4 No reports presented

Then voted to adjourn this to Monday evening December 22^d inst

Monday evening December 22^d 1862.

The Town met according to adjournment.

The committee referred to in the the action of the town under the 2^d article made a verbal report, in substance, that they had made an arrangement by which sixteen men were procured to fill up the town's quota for the Military Service of the United States, that said men had been examined, accepted, and sworn into the said service, and had been properly accredited to the town of Sudbury, and that said committee paid the sum of one hundred and thirty dollars ^{for} each of said men.

Then the town voted to ^{dissolve} ~~adjourn~~ this meeting
