Pursuant to Resolves of the General Court,
entitled Resolves concerning the Amendment
to the Constitution, approved by the Governor,
on the twentieth day of February, in the year
one thousand eight hundred and sixty three,
the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified
to vote for Senators and Representatives in the
General, being duly convened at a meeting
legally warned, and held on "Monday, the
sixth day of April" instant, for the purpose of
giving in their votes, by ballot, for or against
an Article of Amendment to the Constitution
of this Commonwealth, submitted to the People
for their approval or rejection by said Resolves,
and having voted thereon in the manner prescribed,
the ballots given in were sorted, counted, recorded,
and declaration thereof made as by law provided,
and were as follows, to wit;
