To Samuel A Jones, Constable of
the Town of Sudbury in said County, Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of
Massachusetts you are required to notify
and warn the inhabitants of said Town
of Sudbury, qualified to vote in elections
to meet at the Town Hall, in said Town,
on Tuesday, the 3 day of Nov next at ten
o'clock A.M. To bring in their votes to the
Electors, for a Governor, Lieutenant
Governor, Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver
General, Auditor of Accounts, and Attorney
General for this Commonwealth, a Councillor
for District No. 6, and a Senator for the
third Middlesex Senatorial District.

Also for a Register of Probate and Insolvency,
and a County Commissioner for
the County of Middlesex; all on one ballot.

Also to bring in their votes for a Representative
in the next General Court of Massachusetts
for the sixteenth Middlesex Representative
District, on a separate ballot - all the
foregoing votes to be deposited at one checking

Polls to be opened at eleven o'clock A.M.
and may be closed at two o'clock P.M.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant,
by posting up attested printed copies thereof
at the Town House, at each of the public
Meeting Houses, and at some public place
in the Village of Assabet, in said Town, two
Sabbaths at least ^{before} the time appointed for
holding said meeting.
