At a Legal Town Meeting, holden at Sudbury on Monday the seventh day of March A.D. 1864 the Articles in the preceding were taken up and acted upon as follows, viz

Art 1 Chose Capt James Moore, Moderator.

Art 2 Chose Jonas S. Hunt, Town Clerk.

.. Thomas P. Whitcut, Charles Hunt & Walter Rogers, Selectmen.

.. Samuel A. Jones, John N. Dakin & James Moore, Assessors.

.. James Moore, Thomas B. Battles & J. Parker Fairbank Overseers of Poor.

The Town voted to consolidate the Offices of Town Treasurer and Collector of Taxes, so that all business of both said offices should be done by ~~the~~ one person, and to let out said business to the lowest bidder, and Mr Samuel A. Jones agreed to take said office for the sum of fifty-nine dollars, said sum to be payment in full for all services and duties heretofore performed by both the above named officers.

And the said Samuel A. Jones agreed to give bonds for the faithful performance of said duties to the satisfaction of the Selectmen.

Then the Town by ballot chose Samuel A. Jones, Town Treasurer and Collector of Taxes for the year ensuing.
