Art 8. The town voted that the Treasurer of the "Goodnow Library Committee" shall have charge of the funds of the Library, and of all money received from any source for the benefit of it; and shall report to said Committee at any time they may require, exhibiting to them his account; the condition of the funds, the manner of investment, the securities and all matters connected therewith; and the opinion of ~~the~~ a majority of the Committee in relation thereto, expressed by a formal vote shall be binding upon him.

He shall have power to collect by process of law all sums of money due to the town for the benefit of the library, to discharge any mortgage given to secure the Library fund or a part thereof and release the mortgaged premises upon satisfaction of the mortgage; and whenever of any mortgage given to secure the Library fund or a part thereof the conditions shall be broken, he shall have power in the name of the town, to take possession of the mortgaged property for the purpose of foreclosure and to sell and convey said property according to the conditions of the mortgage, or according to law, or lease or otherwise dispose of the same as the Library Committee shall deem most expedient for the interests of the town, and to do all other acts necessary for the management, care or preservation of the said funds.

Art 9 Voted to pass over this Article

Art 10 Voted to grant the sum of fifty dollars, to be expended in repairs on the "Graves Road," so called, and chose George Goodnow an agent for the town to superintend the expenditure of the said grant.
