To Samuel A. Jones, Constable of the Town
of Sudbury, in said County of Middlesex: Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts,
you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of
said town qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet
at the Town Hall in said Town, on Monday, the fourth
day of April, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon
then and there to act on the following Articles, Viz:

- Art 1 To Choose a Moderator to preside at said Meeting
- Art 2 To fill any vacancies that may exist in town offices
- Art 3 To grant money for all necessary town purposes the
year ensuing, and appropriate the same.
- Art 4 To hear and act on reports.
- Art 5 To see if the town will grant money for special
repairs on highways, and choose a Committee to
expend the same.
- Art 6 To determine what shall be done to the sluice, south
of the Common.
- Art 7 To see if the Town will divide any of their highway
wards, and choose surveyors for the same, to do or
act as the town shall deem best.
- Art 8 To see if the Town will pay to the wife of Almer
H. Gay, fifty two dollars as State aid, to do or act
as the town shall determine
- Art 9 To see if the Town will accept of a list of jurors, prepared by
the Selectmen, to do or act as the town shall think best.
