

Art. 3 Under this Article the town voted to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money to pay any part of the Town Debt that may be called for.

Art. 4 Under this Article a verbal report was made by the Selectmen concerning a demand against the town by Dr Hartshorn of Framingham for examining volunteers, and the Town voted to instruct the Selectmen, not to pay said demand.
