Art. 4. Report of the "Goodnow Library Building Committee" was read, accepted and ordered to be recorded, as follows Viz:

"The committee chosen by the Town, May 2^d 1862 to superintend the erection of a building for the "Goodnow Library," have attended to that duty and offer the following Report

The Committee after being organized, agreed upon a plan of a brick building which was reported to, and accepted by the Town, after which the brick for the building were purchased by the Committee and delivered on the spot; the furnishing of the other materials for the building, together with the work, were let out by contract to Mr J. B. Harriman, and the building of the Cellar wall was let out to Hiram R. Goodnow; both the above contracts were fulfilled to the satisfaction of the Committee.

The grading of the land, building of fence in front, setting trees &c were done under the supervision of the chairman of the Committee, according to plans agreed upon by the whole.
