Commonwealth of Massachusetts
Mendell v. 93.

To Samuel A Jones and John R. Harriman,
Constables of Sudbury — Greeting;

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet in their Town House on Thursday the ninth day of June, current, at 3 o'clock, P.M. then and there to act on the following Articles, Viz

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting

Art. 2. To see if the Town will take any measures to procure men by volunteer enlistment or otherwise to fill the Town's quota in anticipation of a call from the president of the United States to recruit the armies of the Volunteer Corps now in the field, to do or act as the Town may think best in reference to procuring men for said service, and also to borrow money to carry the same into effect

Art. 3. To hear and act on reports.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by giving each legal voter at least twenty-four hours notice of the time and place of said meeting

Hereof fail not and make due return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk, at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid
