At a Legal Town Meeting holden at Sudbury on Thursday the 9th day of June A.D. 1864 the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows.

Art 1 Chose Capt James Moore, Moderator.

Art 2 Voted, that the town raise money sufficient to pay one hundred and twenty-five dollars to each volunteer who shall enlist into the service of the United States, and be duly accredited as a part of the quota of the Town of Sudbury, in anticipation of a call from the President to recruit the armies now in the field, and that the selectmen be required to use all proper measures to procure said volunteers

Voted also that the selectmen be authorized to borrow money to carry the foregoing into effect, also that the selectmen be authorized to procure not less than seventeen men, and dispose of the surplus (if any) for the benefit of the town.
