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Commonwealth of Massachusetts,
Middlesex S.S.

To Samuel A. Jones, Constable
of the Town of Sudbury. Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of
Massachusetts, you are required to notify and
warn the Inhabitants of said Town qualified
to vote in Town affairs, to meet at their Town
House, on Monday, the 26th, inst, at 2 o'clock,
P.M. then and there to act on the following
articles, viz:

Art 1st To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.

Art 2^d To see if the Town will accept of a piece of
Town Way as laid out by the Selectmen,
on petition of Joseph Smith and others.

Art 3^d To see what measures the town will take
in regard to a vote, passed at a Public Town
Meeting, holden April 29th, 1861, whereby it
was agreed to pay to each member of the
Madsen's Rifle Guard, who should en-
list into the Military service of the
United States, a sum sufficient to make
their whole pay \$20. per month, while they
should remain in said service.

Art 4 To hear and act on reports

And you are directed to serve this Warr-
rant by posting an attested copy thereof, at
the Town House, at each of the public Meet-
ing Houses, in said town and at some public
place in the Village of Assabet, two Sabbaths
before the time of said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return
of this Warrant, with your doings thereon.
