

November 1864

By a vote of the town passed at a legal town meeting in April last, the Overseers of the Poor were instructed to build a suitable Granary, on the poor farm in said town, the Overseers of the poor have attended to that duty and ask leave to submit the following Report—

We have built a Granary of the following dimensions viz: Twenty feet long, fifteen feet wide, with ten feet posts, — at ad cost as follows, —

Total Amount	\$121.17

And we ask the town to authorize the Overseers to borrow money to pay the same, and we also recommend that the town cut wood or timber from the farm to pay the above sum.

Then the town voted to authorize the Overseers to borrow money to pay the sum named in the above report, — also voted to authorize said Overseers to cut ^{and sell} wood and timber from the farm to pay money borrowed, for said purpose.
