To Samuel A. Jones, Constable of the Town
of Sudbury, in said County. — — Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massa-
chusetts you are required to notify and warn
the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury,
qualified to vote in Town affairs, to meet at
their Town-House, in said Town, on Monday
the 6th day of March next at 10 o'clock, A.M.
then and there to act on the following Articles, Viz:

- Art. 1st To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2^d To choose all necessary Town officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3^d To agree with some suitable person to act as Li-
brarian for the Goodnow Library, and fix upon the
compensation to be made for the ensuing year.
- Art. 4th To see if the town will instruct the School Committee
to appoint a Superintendent of Public Schools, and
also determine what compensation said Super-
intendent shall receive.
- Art. 5 To see if the Town will put new furniture into
one or more of the School Houses, the present
Season; to do or act as the Town shall judge
best
- Art. 6 To see if the Town will allow the Law Reports
and other similar books belonging to the town, to be
kept in the office of Charles Thompson; To do or act
as the Town shall judge best
- Art. 7 To hear and act on reports.
- Art. 8 To see if the Town will provide a set of Runners
for their Hearse
