Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of
Massachusetts you are required to notify
and warn the inhabitants of the
Town of Sudbury, qualified to vote in
Elections to meet at the town Hall
in said Town, on Tuesday the seventh
day of November next at ten o'clock in
the forenoon, to bring in their votes
to the Selectmen for a Governor, Lieutenant
Governor, Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver
General, Auditor of Accounts, and Attorney
General for this Commonwealth; a Councillor
for District No. 6, and a Senator for the
Third Middlesex Senatorial District;
also, their votes for a District Attorney, a Sheriff,
three Commissioners of insolvency, a County
Commissioner and two Special Commission-
ers, for the County of Middlesex; also their
votes for a Register of Deeds for the Middlesex
South District, all on one Ballot.

Also, to bring in their votes for a Representative
in the next General Court of Massachusetts
for the Sixteenth Middlesex Representative
District, on a Separate Ballot.

All the foregoing ballots to be deposited
at one checking.

Polls to be opened at half past ten o'clock
A.M. and may be closed at one o'clock P.M.

And you are also required to notify the in-
habitants of said Town of Sudbury qualified to
vote in Town affairs to assemble at the Town
