

Ans 81st Voted that the Town Hall be opened for Town Meetings. Meetings of Town Officers & Committees and all Political Conferences free. and for all other purposes for which the Inhabitants may use the Hall when an admission is not taken. the person or persons using the the Hall shall pay for lighting warming and taking care of the same during the time they may occupy it; and when an admission fee is charged they shall pay a reasonable sum for the use of said Hall.

2^d Voted. that dancing be prohibited in the Hall for the present year

3^d Voted. that the Hall be closed the present year for all purposes excepting Town Meetings and Meetings of Town Officers & Committees

4th Voted that the Hall be opened free for all lectures sent by the State Board of Education

Voted that the taking care of the Hall be let out to the lowest bidder on the following conditions. viz. - to open the House for all Town Meetings, Meetings of Town Officers & Committees, and for all other purposes when so ordered by the Selectmen, light and warm it when required. be present when it is occupied, and see that everything is kept in proper order, close and fasten the blinds, when the house is not occupied, sweep and keep the house clean and in good order at all times, wash the floors when ordered by the selectmen - saw the wood and put it into the wood closets, remove the snow from the house to the road when necessary, and ring the bell for town meetings.

And if through the fault or neglect of the person taking care of said house the furniture is damaged he shall make the same good without charge to the town, - he shall give bonds if required by the Selectmen, and if at any time he shall neglect to perform the aforesaid duties he shall be removed by the Selectmen and they shall appoint another person to his place. Then let out the taking care of the Town House for the present year, in accordance with the above votes, to Abijah Powers for the sum of ten Dollars.
