To John Goodnow a Constable of the Town of Sudbury in said County, greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections, to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday the third day of November next, it being the Tuesday next after the first Monday of said month, to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for twelve Electors of President and Vice President of the United States, and a Representative in the next Congress of the United States for District No Seven. For a Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver General, Auditor, and Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; for a Councillor for District No. Six and a Senator for Middlesex Senatorial District No. Five; for a Sheriff, District Attorney, Register of Probate and Insolvency, County Commissioner, two Special Commissioners, and three Commissioners of Insolvency for the County of Middlesex, all upon one ballot.

Also to bring in their votes for a Representative to the next General Court of Massachusetts, for Middlesex Representative District No. Nineteen, upon a separate Ballot: both the foregoing ballots to be deposited at one checking.

Polls to be opened at ten o'clock A.M. and may be closed at two o'clock P.M.

And you are also required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Town affairs to assemble at the Town Hall, in said Town on Tuesday the third day of November next at one o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following Articles, viz
