To James L. Willis, a Constable of the
Town of Sudbury, in Said County. Greeting;
In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
you are hereby required to notify and warn the in-
habitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote
in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said
Town, on Monday, the twenty-sixth day of April
inst, at two o'clock in the afternoon, then and there
to act on the following Articles viz:

Art 1st To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting

Art 2nd To grant money for necessary purposes

Art 3rd To see if the Town will accept of certain alterations
in a highway, at the village of Assabet, petitioned
for by Amory Maynard, Esq; and others and laid
out by the Selectmen.

Art 4th To see what action the town will take in ref-
erence to the case of Thomas Pierce a State Pauper
to do or act &c.

Art 5th To see if the town will take any measures to improve
the public Burial grounds, to do or act as the town
may think best.

Art 6th To see if the town will give the Overseers of the Poor
any instructions concerning the wood upon the Poor
Farm

Art 7th To see if the town will give the Selectmen any ins-
tructions relative to the letting out of the business of
Sexton, to do or act in reference to said business
as the town may think best.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by post-
ing attested copies thereof at the Town House, at each
of the Public Meeting Houses and at the Post Office in
the Village of Assabet in said town two Sabbaths at least
before the time appointed for holding said meeting
Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant
with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk at or before
the time of said meeting.
