To James L. Willis, a constable of the Town of Sudbury, in said county: Greeting. In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to Notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the Twenty-fourth day of January, current, at two o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following articles viz:

Article 1st. To choose a Moderator to preside in said Meeting.

Art 2^d. To see if the town will subscribe to the capital stock of the "Massachusetts Central Rail Road Company" a sum not exceeding five per centum of the assessed valuation of the town, provided said road shall be so constructed, that at some point it shall not be more than forty rods from the guidepost at the junction of the "Berlin and Assalet roads" so called, near the centre of said Sudbury.

Art 3^d. To take any ~~reaction~~ which may be deemed necessary or desirable, to carry into effect the action upon the foregoing article.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting an attested copy thereof at the Town House, at each of the Public Meeting Houses, and at the Post Office at the village of Assalet in said town two Sabbaths at least, before the time appointed for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk, at or before the time of meeting aforesaid. Given under our hands this thirteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy.
