

Art 4 Report of Selectmen on the Receiving Tomb read and accepted.

This Report showed the total expense of building the Receiving tomb to have been \$488.86.

The Selectmen also reported that they had procured a Cooler for the use of the inhabitants in preparing bodies for burial, at an expense to the town of \$37.00.

The Selectmen for the past year were ordered by the town to draft suitable regulations for the management of the Receiving tomb and report the same at April Meeting.

Report of the Committee on repairs of the S. W. School House was read and accepted, said report showed the total expense of said repairs to have been \$793.58.

Report of the Overseers of the Poor read and accepted, and said report showed the total amount of receipts on account of the support of poor for the past year to have been \$2722.39, and the expenditures \$2895.00, leaving a balance against the town of \$172.61.

Reports of the overseers of the poor on the distribution of the funds for benefit of poor read and accepted.

Art 5. Voted that the Taxes be made payable and collected in the same manner as last year. Voted also to let out the business of Town Treasurer and Collector of Taxes to the lowest bidder and the said business was taken by Samuel A. Jones for the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, said sum to be payment in full for performing all the duties pertaining to both offices.

Art 6 Voted to build a new school house in the N. E. School District the present year, - that said new school house be located at or near the junction of the "Puffer Lane" and "North Road", and chose Charles Thompson, Leander Haynes and George W. Barton were chosen a committee to carry into effect the above votes.
