

Middlessex, S.S. March 15th 1870

To the Constables or either of them in the Town of Sudbury in Said County of Middlessex.

The Selectmen of Said Sudbury having refused to call a meeting of the legal voters of Said town of Sudbury for the purpose of acting on the petition of John Hunt and ten or more legal voters of Said town of Sudbury. Now this is to require you the said Constables of Said Sudbury to notify and warn the said legal voters of Said Sudbury to meet at the Town Hall in Said Sudbury on Monday the twenty eighth day of March instant at two o'clock P.M. to act on the following Articles.

1st To choose a Moderator of Said meeting

2^d To see if the town will give the committee chosen to build a schoolhouse in the North East district any further instructions in reference to the location of said house to do or act in reference to said location as the town shall think best.

And you are required to serve this warrant by posting an attested copy thereof at the Town House, at each of the public Meeting Houses, and at the Post Office, at Assabet Village in Said town two sabbaths at least before the time of holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
