To James L. Willis a Constable of the Town of Sudbury in said County, Greeting;  
In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs To meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the sixth day of September next at three o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles: namely:

Art 1<sup>st</sup> To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting

Art 2<sup>d</sup> To see if the Town will vote that no person shall be allowed to sell ale, porter, strong beer or Lager Beer.

Art 3<sup>d</sup> To see if the Town will take the necessary measures to procure a lot of land for the location of a school house in the southerly part of the North east district to do or act as the Town shall think best

Art 4 To see if the Town will choose a committee to repair the road leading past the house of John Taylor, and the great road from Sudbury Centre to Wayland line.

Art 5. To see if the Town will discharge the committee chosen at a former meeting to remove the north east school house or build a new school house in the southerly part of said district, from all further action concerning said subject.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting an attested copy thereof at the Town House, at each of the public Meeting Houses, and at the Post Office in the Village of Assabet
