of land lying between land of Aaron Hunt known as the "Casey place," and land of Andrew Hunt, and held by Alexander Hayes and John Eaton, both of Sudbury and Thomas Hunt of Brighton, trustees: Said school house lot to be bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning at the corner of the wall at the northwesterly corner of the premises and thence running easterly by said "Casey place" nine rods: then southerly at right angles with the northerly line, nine rods: then westerly at right angles with the easterly line to the easterly side of the road leading to Concord: thence northerly by said road to the point of beginning.

Voted, also that the Selectmen be authorized to select at their discretion, and lay out a lot of land for the location of a school house in the southerly part of the north east district, and appraise the damages therefor, according to the provisions and with the restrictions of section 38 of chapter 38 of the General Statutes, if the owners of the lot designated by the ~~lot designated by the~~ town refuse to sell the same, or demand therefor a price deemed by the Selectmen unreasonable.

Art 4 Voted to instruct the Surveyors of Highways in the wards containing the the roads referred to in this article, to work out the balance of Highway taxes in their hands immediately, and report to the Selectmen.
