To James S. Willis or any Constable of the Town of Sudbury in said County, Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Monday the second day of January next at one o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following Articles Viz:

- 1st To Choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- 2^d To see what method the town will adopt to raise money to pay the town's subscription to stock in the Framingham and Lowell Railroad, To do or act in reference to raising money for necessary purposes as the town shall judge best.
- 3^d To hear and act on reports.
- 4th To hear the report of the Selectmen, making certain alterations in the road between the house of Capt. William Brigham and the South West School house in Sudbury, laid out on the petition of Dana W. Hayden and others, and act thereon.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting attested thereof, at the Town House, at each of the public Meeting-houses and at the post office in the Village of Assabet, in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time appointed for holding said Meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town clerk, at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
