Greeting;

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Monday, the 23<sup>d</sup> day of January current, at two o'clock P.M. precisely, then and there to act on the following Articles viz;

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting

Art 2<sup>d</sup> To see if the Town will make amicable arrangements by which they will permit that portion of the Territory of said Sudbury commonly known as Assabet to unite with a portion of Stow, to form a separate town, to do or act on said subject as the Town may think best.

Art 3<sup>d</sup> To see if the Town will take any measures to oppose the setting off of any part of their Territory as a new town, or as part of a new town.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting an attested copy thereof at the Town House at each of the Public Meeting-Houses, and at the Post-Office in the Village of Assabet, in said town, two Sabbaths, at least before the time appointed for holding said meeting.

Hereby fail not, and make due return of this Warrant, with your doings thereon, to the town Clerk, at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
