At a Legal Town Meeting held at the Town Hall in Sudbury on Monday the Twentythird day of January A.D. 1871. the articles in the preceding Warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows. Viz.

Art 1 Chose James Moore, Esq Moderator

Art 2 Voted to pass over this Article by a ye and nay vote of 183. to 88.

Art 3^d That a Committee of three be appointed by the chair, to retire and nominate a committee of three to oppose any petition to the General Court, to set off any part of the territory of the Town of Sudbury — the chair appointed Messrs J. P. Fairbank, Dexter C Jones and J. S. Hunt, who retired and nominated Dea. Thomas P. Hurlbut, Charles Thompson, Esq, and James Moore, Esq, and the town by vote accepted the gentlemen nominated for said committee; and voted that this committee be authorized and instructed to use all honorable means which in their judgement will aid in preventing the formation of a new town including any part of the territory of the Town of Sudbury.

Then voted to dissolve this meeting.
