To James & Willis or any Constable of the Town of Sudbury in said County greeting:
 In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Monday the fourth day of September next at three o'clock in the Afternoon, then and there to act on the following Articles Viz:

- Art 1 To choose a Moderator
- Art 2 To see if the Town will choose a Committee to meet the Commissioners to oppose the laying out of a road petitioned for by Frank E. Bent and twelve others.
 To do or act
- Art 3 To see if the Town will take any measures to provide Hay Scales to be located near the Centre of the Town
- Art 4 To hear the report of a committee chosen at a former meeting in regard to building a Schoolhouse in the West part of the Town.
 to do or act as the Town think best.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting an attested copy thereof at the Town House and at each of the public Meeting Houses in said Town two Sabbaths at least before the time appointed for holding said meeting.

Heretof fail not and make due return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
