

- Art 2<sup>d</sup> Voted also that said committee be instructed to employ a competent Engineer to examine said road, to estimate the cost of the proposed repairs - the same to be reported to the town, by the committee at some future meeting.
- Art 3 Voted to accept the report of the Laying out of said private Way and to appropriate the sum of Twelve Dollars to pay the expense as reported
- Art 4 Voted to give the Free use of the Town Hall lighted and warmed for a free Singing School
- Art 5 Voted to oppose the petition referred to in this article - Voted also that a former committee, consisting of Messrs Thomas P. Marlbut Charles Thompson and James Moore <sup>be instructed</sup> to take any and all measures which they may think proper to prevent any change in the act of Incorporation of the Town of Maynard
- Art 6 Voted to appropriate any unappropriated money now in the treasury to pay the expense of building the School House in the Westerty part of the town  
Voted also informally - to order the Selectmen to draw upon the Treasurer for money received for the old N.E. School house to pay for support of a school in the new School House in the Westerty part of the town the coming winter
- Art 7 Voted that the Selectmen be instructed to provide three sets of Hooks & Ladders, for use in case of fires - also to provide a suitable place in the Center of the town in the South part, and in the north part, in which to keep said articles, and to appoint
