Town of Sudbury in said County, Greeting;

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Elections to meet in their Town Hall, on Tuesday the second day of November next at ten o'clock in the forenoon.

To bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver General, Auditor and Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; a Councillor for District No. 6, a Senator for Middlesex Senatorial District No. 5, and a County Commissioner for the County of Middlesex, all on one ballot.

Also to bring in their votes for a Representative to the next General Court of Massachusetts for Middlesex Representative District No. 19, upon a separate ballot; both the foregoing ballots to be deposited at one checking;

Polls to be opened at ten o'clock A.M. and may be closed at two o'clock P.M.

And you are required to serve this warrant by posting ^{an} attested copy thereof at the Town House, at each of the Public Meeting Houses, at each of the Post Offices, and at each of the Railroad Depots in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time of meeting as aforesaid.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at or before the time of meeting aforesaid.
