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Commonwealth of Massachusetts
Middlesex S.S. To James L. Willis a Constable

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of said Town of Sudbury, qualified to vote in Town affairs to meet at their Town Hall, on Monday the Thirtieth day of June, inst at four o'clock P.M. then and there to act on the following Articles. Viz:

Art 1st To choose a Moderator to preside in said Meeting.

Art 2. To see what action the Town will take concerning a suit brought against the Town by Albert Haynes for damage occasioned by an alleged defect in a highway

Art 3 To hear and act on reports

Art 4. To see if the Town will cause a new floor to be laid in the Town Hall

And you are hereby directed to serve this Warrant by posting attested copies thereof at the Town House - at each of the public Meeting houses, at each Post office - and at each of the Railroad Stations, in said Town, two Sabbaths at least before the time of said Meeting

Hereby fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at the meeting aforesaid.
