To James L. Willis, a Constable
of the Town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting
In the name of the Commonwealth of Massa-
chusetts, you are directed to notify and warn
the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified
to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall
in said Sudbury, on Monday the twenty-
seventh day of September next, at two o'clock
in the afternoon, then and there to act on
the following articles:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside in said
meeting
- Art. 2. To hear the report of the committee chosen
to take into consideration the matter of ad-
ditional school facilities for the south part of
the town
- Art. 3. To see what action the town will take in
regard to building a School House in the
south part of the town
- Art. 4. To see if the town will accept a straightening
of the highway laid out by the Selectmen near
the house of ^{the late} William Brigham to do or act as
the town may think best

And you are directed to serve this Warrant
by posting up attested copies thereof at the Town
House, at each of the public meeting houses,
at each Post Office and at each Railroad
Station in said town two Sabbaths at least
before the time for holding said meeting.

Whereof fail not and make due return
of this Warrant with your doings thereon
to the Town Clerk at or before the time and
place of meeting as aforesaid
