To James L. Willis, a Constable
of the town of Sudbury in said County - Greeting;

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
you are hereby required to notify and warn
the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury, qualified
to vote in elections, to meet at the Town Hall
in said town on Tuesday the second day of
November next, it being the "Tuesday next
after the first Monday in said month, to bring
in to the Selectmen their votes for thirteen
Electors of President and Vice President of the
United States, and a Representative in the
next Congress of the United States for Dis-
trict No. Seven. For a Governor, Lieutenant-
Governor, Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver-
General, Auditor and Attorney General of
the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

For a Councillor for District No. Six, and
a senator for Middlesex Senatorial District
No. Five, and for a Sheriff, District Attorney,
County Commissioner, two Special Commis-
sioners, and three Special Commissioners
of Insolvency for Middlesex County, all on
one ballot.

Also to bring in their votes for a Represen-
tative to the next General Court of Massachusetts,
for Middlesex Representative District No.
Twenty Seven. Both the foregoing ballots
to be deposited at one checking.

Polls to be opened at ten o'clock A.M. and
may be closed at two P.M.

And you are also required to notify and warn
the inhabitants of said Sudbury qualified to
vote in Town affairs to meet at the Town Hall
on Tuesday the second day of November next
at one o'clock in the afternoon then and
there to act on the following Articles Viz:

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.
