

November 1880

At a legal Town Meeting held at Snellbury the third day of November A.D. 1880 the several articles in the warrant for said meeting recorded on Page 341 of this book, were taken up and acted upon as follows. Viz:

Art. 1. Chose James Moore Esq Moderator

Art 2. Voted to build a School house in the south part of the town - said house to be located on the west side of Landham brook, so called.
 Voted to appropriate the sum of Twenty-five hundred dollars, to pay for said school house and the land upon which it shall be built.
 Voted to choose a committee of five persons to decide upon the location, and to superintend the building of said schoolhouse.
 Voted to instruct said committee to let out the building of said schoolhouse, by contract, to be completed on or before the first day of January next -
 Voted to instruct the School Committee to provide the necessary furniture for said School house.
 Voted to authorize the Treasurer to borrow money, sufficient for the above named purposes.

Art 3. Voted to appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars for the singing school already commenced in the town hall and that the selectmen be a committee to hire the present teacher and expend the sum appropriated.

Art 4. Voted to give the free use of the Town Hall for the singing school.

Art 5. Voted to give the free use of the Hall for the monthly meetings of the Band of Hope for one year from the first of April A.D. 1880.

Art 6. Voted to give the free use of the Town Hall to the Band.
