In the name of the Commonwealth of Mass-
achusetts you are hereby required to notify
and warn the inhabitants of Sudbury qualified
to vote in town affairs to meet at the Town
Hall in said town on Monday the fifth
day of September next at two o'clock in
the afternoon then and there to act on the
following articles, Viz:

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside in said Meeting

Art. 2 To see if the Town will accept the laying out
of a road by the Selectmen, on petition of
Thomas Q. Newbott and others, to do or act in
the matter as the town shall think best

Art. 3. To see if the town will accept the laying out
of a gravel Pit by the Selectmen, on land of
Wm L. E. Perry in the westerly part of the Town.

And you are required to serve this warrant
by posting attested copies thereof at the Town
House, at each of the Public Meeting Houses,
at each Post Office and at each Railroad
Station in said town, two Sabbaths at
least before the time appointed for holding
said meeting

of this warrant with your doing thereon to the Town
Clerk at or before the time of said Meeting
