Art. 5.

All Taxes of nonresidents payable in full on the first day of September, and all other Taxes in two equal installments. The first on the first day of September and the second on the first day of December, and that the collector be authorized to collect interest at the rate of six per cent per annum on all Taxes due and unpaid after Ten days from the above dates.

Voted to consolidate the offices of Town Treasurer and collector of Taxes, and that the compensation for the performance of all the duties of both said offices be fixed at two hundred and twenty dollars.

Art. 6.

Voted to order the receipts of and expenditures for the present year to be printed.

Art. 7

Voted that the Town Treasurer and the Chairman of the Selectmen be a committee to fund the Town Debt excepting the Charity Funds if the same can be done at a rate of interest not exceeding four per cent per annum. Voted also that the expenses of the new road now in the process of construction be included in the amount proposed to be funded by the preceding votes.

Art. 8

Voted that the use of the Town Hall be granted to the citizens of the town for all lectures, lyceums, and farmers' Clubs, for the year ensuing, free, by parties occupying the same paying the actual cost of lighting, warming and taking care of the same; and for all entertainments when tickets are sold at the door a fee of three dollars shall be charged, up to twelve o'clock and one dollar per hour thereafter until two o'clock when it shall in all cases be closed. All cancesses and Memorial day's services absolutely free. Parties from out of town to pay same as last year.
