

- Art. 5. Voted that the matter of procuring gravel for repairs of roads be referred to the Selectmen
- Art. 6. Voted that a committee of three persons be appointed by the chair to examine the claim of Lyman Parmenter - to confer with him or his counsel, with reference to a settlement of the whole matter, & to report at April Meeting, and the chair appointed Messrs Edward E. Brown, Samuel B. Rozick and Seneca A. Wilson.
- Art. 7. Voted that the Selectmen of the Town be instructed to close its fiscal year at such time as to enable them to have the Annual Reports printed for distribution, before the Annual Meeting in March
- Art. 8. Voted to pass over this article
- Art. 9 Voted to refer the subject of grading and fencing the School-house lot in District No. 5, to the School Committee
- Art. 10. Voted that the Town shall indemnify the collector of Taxes for expenses, that may be incurred by him, in collecting or attempting to collect any taxes that may have been illegally assessed.
- Art. 11. Voted that the Selectmen be instructed to collect the Hooks & Ladders belonging to the town, and cause the same to be sold at Auction at the Town house, immediately after the close of the Annual Town Meeting in April next
- Art 12 Voted to make no alterations in the Bylaws of the Woodrow Library
