

At a legal Town Meeting held at Sudbury, on the fourth day of November A.D. 1884 the Articles in the warrant for said meeting, were taken up and acted upon as follows. viz:

Art. 1. Chose Edgar W. Rice Esqr Moderator

Art. 2. No Reports offered

Art. 3. Voted that fuel for the several schools be furnished from the Poor farm the ensuing year as usual.

Art. 4. Voted that the Town appropriate one hundred and twenty-five dollars out of the "Town Grant" of the present year for support of Poor, to be expended for the benefit of Mrs Dora Smith and family, the said sum to be placed in the hands of Turner J. Sanderson for expenditure, the said Sanderson agreeing that no further assistance ^{from the town} shall be called for before the first of April next provided there is no sickness in said family

Art. 5. Voted to accept of a donation of Ten Thousand Dollars offered the town by George Goodnow of Boston for the purpose set forth in this Article. Voted, also, on motion of Recr George A. Orratt, "That we do now as a town by vote express our hearty thanks to the donor of this generous fund, assuring him of our appreciation of his love of his native town and equally of his noble desire to render aid to the needy therein, and may his sunset of life be bright to the last, and terminate in the day of endless light and blessedness."

Art 6 Voted that the Annual meeting in March next be held on the third Monday of said month

Then Voted to dissolve this meeting
