

Given to Thomas Galbraid for and in consideration
of building a mill forty acres of upland or there about
near adjoining to the mill and a little piece of
meadow down wards and a piece of meadow upward
it may be six score or twenty acres or there about.

Also there is given for his accommodations for his estate
thirty acres of meadow and forty acres of upland.

the 14th day of May 1643

All the land heretofore given to August Galbraid
is confirmed to him by the freemen of the town
in the borough of the town and gave it over
to him

The meadow swamp formerly granted
to August Galbraid is further confirmed
to John Groat the 22 day of May 1643
