

Orders agreed upon the 29th day of the first month 34
1641.

Imposed. It is agreed that every cart with four sufficient
oxen or a man shall have for a day's work five
shillings

It is ordered that men shall take for mowing by the
acre, fourteen pence for ordinary and for one and twenty
pence a day in mowing

It is ordered that all carpenters bricklayers and that part
shall have one and twenty pence for a day's work and
common labourers eight pence a day

It is ordered that all farmers shall take for carrying
of bread three shillings four pence the hundred and for
grain two shillings they shall take four shillings and eight
pence the hundred.

It is ordered that a yearly assessment for the
best of them shall take but five pounds for a
year's service and may for the best take
but fifty shillings for a year's service

It is ordered that all the houses in the
general streets in this town of Sudbury shall
be shut up by the 10th day of the second month
or else to forfeit for every house unfurnished
five shillings

It is ordered if none shall take above six pence a
busket for bringing up of goods from water to
the Sudbury and twenty shillings of turre for
any other goods
