either ^{cow} cowhounds hedges or goates shall come into any roone
where english reene is sown and if any rattle shall be
upon any sown reene the owner thereof shall pay for each
leade of rattle ^{in the} ~~the~~ experience if the fault be not in the fence
where the rattle come in, and every rod of fence that shall
be defective shall forfeit 12 according to a former order this
order shall take effect from the 17th day of this present until
next Andrew harvest be in next session in the 10th and
moneth and any man that shall finde any rattle for
shall have power to impound them and shall have the
damage of the rattle for trespassage & if the damage
be upon the fence the owner of the fence is to have the
damage for the defect of the fence and the owner of the
fence defective shall pay for the damage of the rattle
to the man that pound them.
