

The 13th of May 1644 It is agreed betwene Edmond Vire John
and John how, that whosoever Edmond Vire had formerly granted to
six acres of land next to the house lott of William Wards And John how
had ten acres of land lying upon pnt playne And John how
eight of upland on the west side of the river the parties hand by a
joynt consent exchanged each with other that is to say that from that day
John Moore shall possess and enjoy the eight acres of upland formerly
granted to John how And John how shall possess and enjoy the six acres
formerly granted to Edmond Vire And all for two acres of the aforesaid
ten acres lying upon pnt playne w^{ch} two acres shall lie next to the
land of Edmond Goodnow. And the said Edmond Vire shall possess and
enjoy the other eight acres of land lying upon pnt playne w^{ch} he
the said Edmond Vire formerly sold to the said John Moore
witness Edmond Goodnow Hugh Griffyn

Mr Edmond Brown bought of Hugh Drury three acres of upland lying
next to timber necke beinge parte of a flatt of ground w^{ch} partell of land
the towne formerly granted to Hugh Drury and Toyne to the land of the
said Edmond Brown.

Edmond Goodnow bought of John Hayme his house and house lott lying
betwene the house lott of the said Edmond and the house lott of Thomas Hyllyer
And all for three acres of upland lyinge to the house of the said John
Hayme lyinge betwene the land of the said Edmond and a litle way
parte it from the land of John Coler of w^{ch} partell of land one acre
and a halfe the said John Hayme bought of Thomas Hyllyer

John Hayme bought of Edmond Goodnow a parcell of upland containing
by estimation eight acres or there about be the same more or lesse lyinge
on the west side of the river betwene the land of the said John Hayme
and the land of John Goodnow, witness William how Hugh Griffyn

William how bought of Edmond Goodnow a parcell of upland containing
by estimation four acres or there about be the same more or lesse w^{ch}
parcell of land lyed betwene the house lott of John Wlandford and the
house lott of Thomas white w^{ch} land was first granted to Joseph
Taynter and by him sold to Mr Howden and by him sold to William how
And by him sold to the said Edmond Goodnow. witness John Hayme Hugh Griffyn

John Wlandford hath bought of William how the aforesaid parcell of upland w^{ch} the said
William how bought of Edmond Goodnow lyinge betwene the house lott of the said
John Wlandford and the house lott of Thomas white In satisfaction whereof
the said John Wlandford hath sold unto the said William how the house and
house lott and one acre and halfe of upland all w^{ch} lyed betwene the land
of John Coler and the land of John Wnt w^{ch} said house and land were
the possession of the widow Wright who now is the wife of the
said John Wlandford. witness Hugh Griffyn
