

granted to Edmond Goodmore twelve acres of upland lying upon the
 layne bounded upon the east side with the land of Edmond Kute senior and
 upon the west side to the land of William Kerley formerly formerly granted
 to Mr. ffourdum.

Also one acre and half of upland lies the same more or less lying between
 the land of John Hayne and the land of John Toll and parted from the high
 way from the Goufollott of the said Edmond.

The town of Hatfield liberty to Walter Hayne to lay down ten acres of
 meadow being a parte of his forre division of meadowe now lyng on the west
 side of the river And to take up for it ten acres of meadow lying on the
 west side of the river more to the west side of the townshoude now said
 meadowe is commonly knowne by a hill of upland that lyeth within the said meadowe
 now ten acres is part of the said meadowe and runn under the hill And the
 said meadowe is called by the name of Kudge meadowe.

granted to Thomas Plinton ten acres of upland lying on the west
 side of the River at Strawberry bank now lying to the land of John Toll
 & the land of John Wlandford.

Thomas Plinton bought of William Kerley three acres of upland lying
 on the west side of the River lying between the land of John Goodmore
 and Robert Beale parted from the great River meadowe by the highway.

granted to John Redyatt ten acres of upland lying south west to the
 land of Robert Darvill & south east to the Goufollott formerly granted
 to John Knight.

Also three acres of upland lying at the grape pond now lying to
 the North east of the land formerly granted to Edmond Kute &
 now in the possession of John how.
