

May the first 1645. Granted to Thomas Wisbige fowrell
of meadowe conteyning by estimation ten acres or there abo
the same more or lesse lymge by the ashen swampe and are
ly ralled and knowne by the ashen swampe meadowes pauning
and brooke runn through them & they ioyned to a parcell of meadow
granted to Edmond And lymge on the north west side of the broo
betwixen the said meadow & the upland of William Browne.

Granted to Henry Curteis ten acres of upland lymge on the south side
of millbrooke ioyninge to the brooke and parted from the brooke for
the lande of John Cutler the south side lymge to the higgeway lead
on to the 2nd playne.

M^r Peter Moyes bought of Thomas Goodenow the house and househol
of the said Thomas Goodenow conteyninge by estimation fowre acres
or thereabout lymge betwixt the househol of the said Peter Moyes
and the househol of Andrew Belcher.

Thomas Goodenow bought of M^r Peter Moyes fowre acres of upland
lymge upon a necke of land betwixt Millbrooke and millbrook
betwixt parte of the second division of upland of the said Peter Moyes
where said fowre acres lyed at the end next to Millbrooke and ioyned
to the lande of Robert Danies.

Granted to Sara Calbrad widow fowrtie acres of upland lymge
in the south parte of the towne bounde ioyninge to the east side of the
lande of Thomas Goodenow.

John Goodenow bought of Andrew Belcher his house & househol and
all other lande and meadowes belonging to the said Andrew
Belcher formerly granted unto him; or that shall hereafter be
due unto the said Andrew Belcher by vertue of his first right
in the beginninge of the plantation of Sudbury.

John Moore bought of John Stone his dwelling house & househol
with all other lande and meadowes belonging to the said John Stone
or that shall hereafter be due unto the said John Stone by vertue
of his first right in the beginninge of the plantation of Sudbury
and alsoe all the fences that is now standing about any parte of
the said lande and alsoe all the boorde and sheldes that are now
about the house whether fast or loose & now belonging to the
said house.

John Goodenow bought of Henry Colar an acre and a half of upland
lymge upon the pynd hill and ioyned to the lande of the said
John Goodenow lymge on the backe side of the now dwelling
house of the said John Goodenow a parcell of land the said John
Goodenow sold half an acre to John Tudducke with the way and
gave liberty to John Tudducke to lay downe the same to the
common and to take it up upon the plaine before the now
dwelling house of the said John Tudducke need the same to be
